


## Our Week of Learning



We have been investigating minibeasts in Science and went on a Bug Hunt this week. There were lots on microhabitats and plenty of creatures to discover. Of course, this class love sharing their own knowledge with others and have been telling me lots of facts about insects and arachnids that they have found. Plenty of our children seem to have pet spiders!

We have had a very exciting time this week putting on our performance 'Rock Bottom'. All the children were absolutely amazing in their performances, remembering all their lines and remembering when to come on and off. They worked so hard and it all paid off as they produced a fantastic performance – we hope you all enjoyed it! In Science this week, we have continued with our Plants topic and became botanists on Friday when we dissected a flower to research all the parts and their functions. In Maths, we finished our measuring topic by looking

at perimeter or shape. All the children were very precise and accurate in their drawing of the shapes and accurately calculating the perimeter, using their addition skills. In Topic, the children used different sources to research the different features of the rainforest, such as the people who live there, the medicinal plants that are used, as well as the climate and food that grows there.

We have had a very exciting week this week. The children performed brilliantly in the play for the parents. They had to learn so many lines; think about the timings of delivery (especially the jokes); actions as well as the acting; the manipulating of all the props; when to come on and off; as well as all the song lyrics and actions. On top of this we had a science day on Tuesday that the children loved. We made electrical series circuits using bulbs, buzzers and motors. The children learned how to fix an incomplete circuit and how to draw diagrams of what they had done. They also made their own toggle, slide and selector switches using cardboard, paperclips, bulldog clips and split pins.

During topic sessions this week we have been looking at inventors and all of the children made paper cup telephones. They were amazing.

We are extremely proud of how well the class are learning all the multiplication facts. They are getting quicker at recalling the answer and are looking so much more confident. Well done!

This week year 5 enjoyed a fantastic trip to the Black Country Living Museum in Dudley to enhance our learning on Victorians. We kicked off our day with a unique workshop on pewter casting where the children got to work with molten pewter to make a wonderful model of either a guitar, motorbike, or bus. Straight after that, we went down a mine for a grippingly authentic adventure. It was pitch black down there and we experienced the sounds and smells of a working mine with torches that replicated the candlelight that would have been used at the time. Occasionally there were rumbles and flashes of light which illuminated figures and the accompanying recordings of voices explained the perils of the job in the miners' own words, using local dialect. It was an exciting and at times scary experience, but we all survived. The children also enjoyed looking at a selection of house and shop interiors from across the years and they particularly enjoyed the old-fashioned sweet shop where fruit pips, lemon Sherbets and strawberry bon bons were bought in abundance.


