
# Year 2

We are investigating Materials and their properties in Science, building on the knowledge they gained in Autumn term. The class carried out an investigation on which materials they could squash, twist, bend and stretch whilst discussing their properties and working as a group.

We continued our 'Creating Pictures' unit in Computing and this week the children produced artwork in the style of Pointillism. Our class truly loves a creative project and have all been excited to continue this piece of work.
